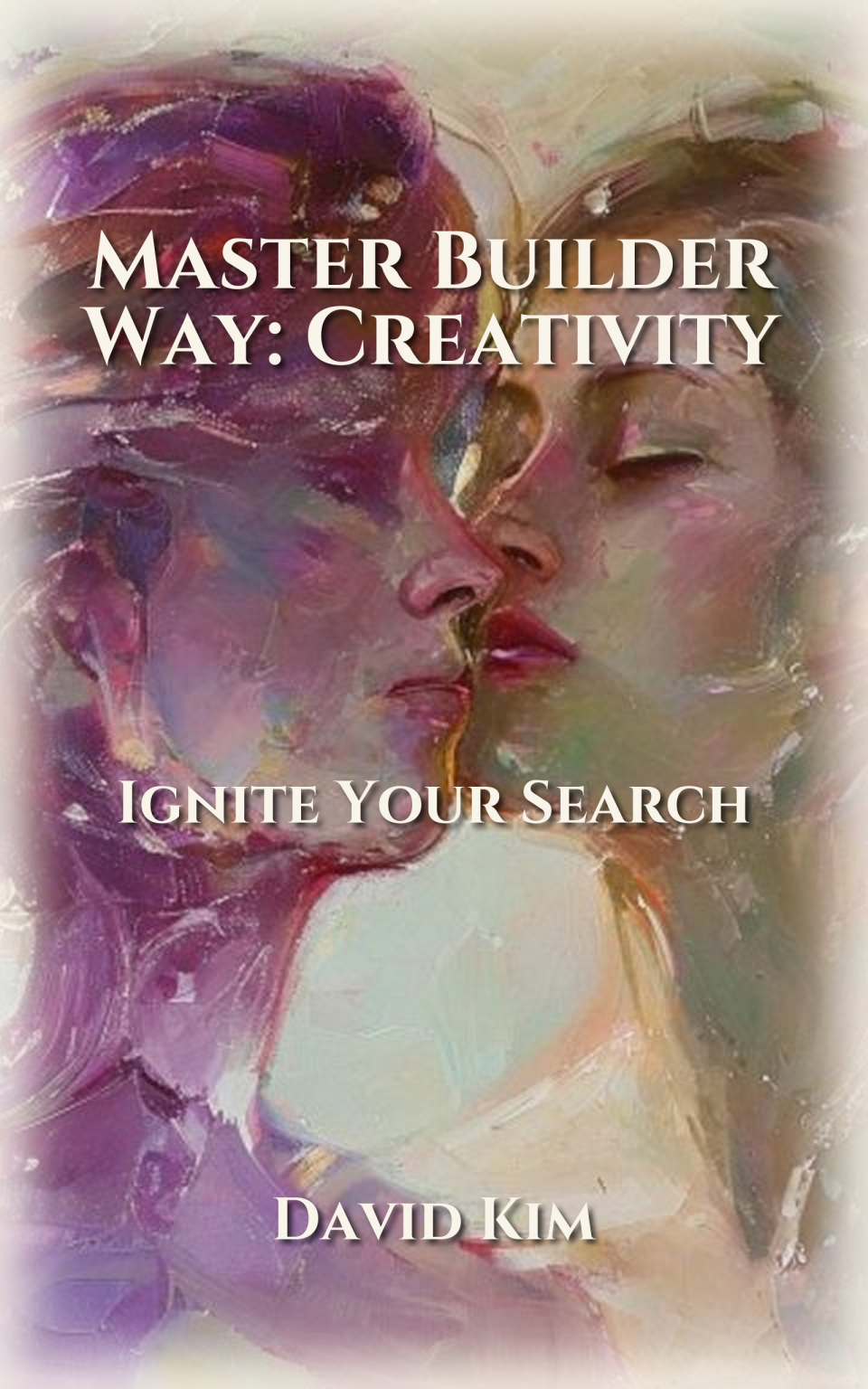




MASTER BUILDER WAY: CREATIVITY
